Eden Hall Wines

Eden Valley, where the vines enjoy a long, cool ripening period, is regarded as the jewel in the crown of the Barossa. Nestled in rolling hills of the Eden Valley lays the historic Avon Brae property. From the Avon Brae vineyard the very best parcels of fruit are reserved for picking at optimum flavour to be made into wine under the Eden Hall label.

Winemakers comments – James Irvine, Joanne Irvine.

The 2003 Eden Hall Shiraz Viognier shows lifted ripe fruit and white pepper over spicy French and American Oak creating a complex bouquet. On the palate there is greatness in size, flavour, depth, fullness of fruit and fine soft tannins. The small addition of Viognier (5%) completes the wine adding to the complexity with an exciting silky finish.

A wine of great potential not only reflecting the exceptional year but most certainly the individuality of the vineyard and the regional characters of the terroir.
